### Summary of adopted changes

- Shorten Route 8 to run between the Mount Baker Transit Center and the Seattle Center to improve reliability.
- Buses will come more often on weekdays, Saturdays, and Sundays.
- Rename the southern part of Route 8, between Rainier Beach and Mount Baker, as new Route 38.
- Extend service by one hour on Saturday and Sunday nights.
- This route will have improved service thanks to Seattle voters.

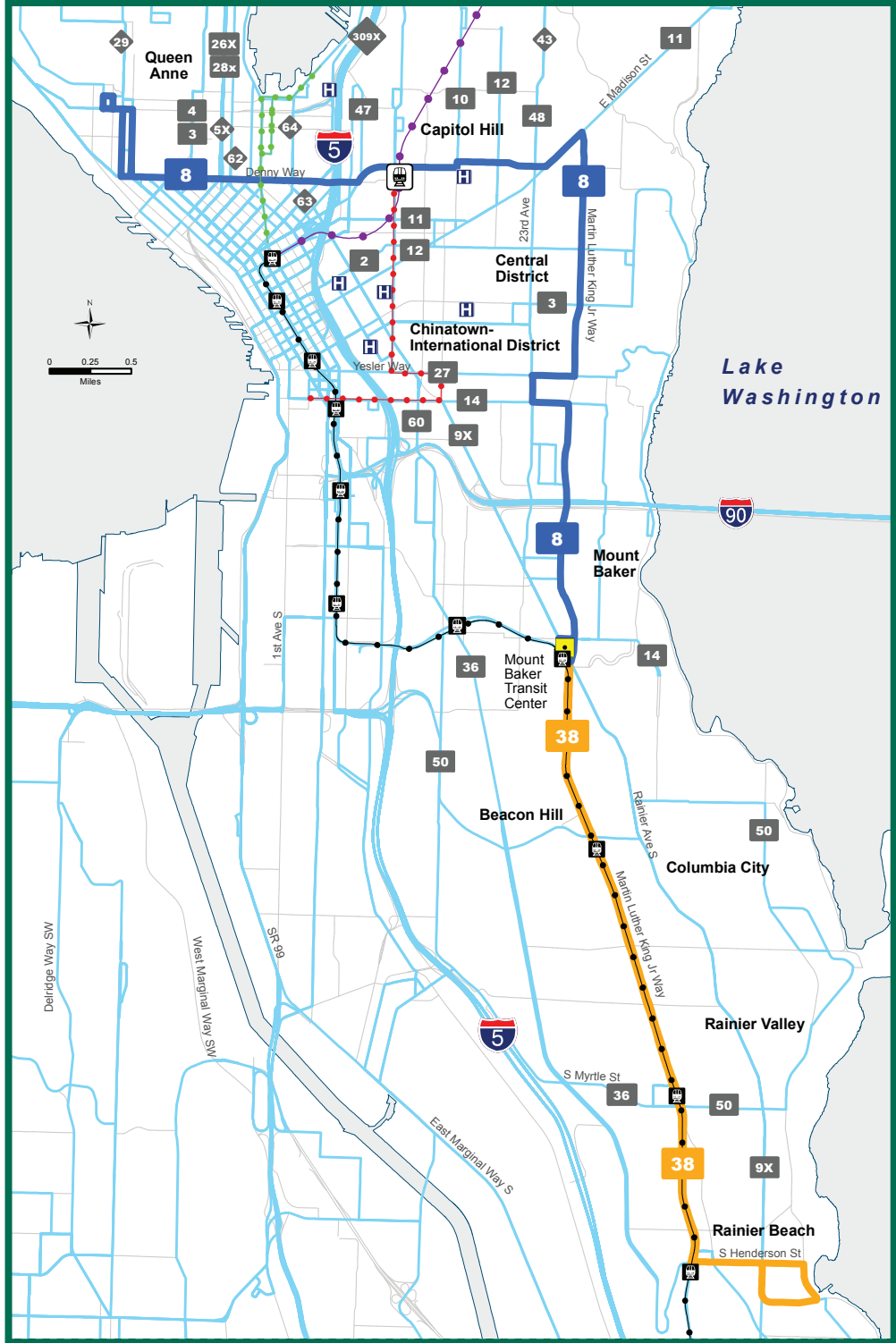
