Rideshare—Riding Together, Pooling Resources

If you have a regular work or school commute schedule and want to share a ride and transportation costs, think about carpools, vanpools or vanshares.

To connect with others who want to share a ride, Metro offers a free online ridematching service called RideshareOnline.com—it matches you with others who share a similar commute. RideshareOnline.com also provides a map showing commuter matches and their general location to help you select the best carpool or vanpool option.

Vanpool

With more than 1400 commuter vans on the road, King County Metro has the largest and longest-running public commuter van program in the nation. Commuter vans help more than ten-thousand commuters get to and from work each day, with more than three-million trips each year.

A vanpool is a group of 5-15 commuters who:

- Share a common commute.
- Volunteer as their group's drivers and bookkeepers.
- Pay a monthly distance-based fare that covers gas, insurance, maintenance, 24-hour roadside assistance and a guaranteed-ride-home program.

The average cost is about the same as a monthly ORCA transit pass, and may even be free or discounted with an employer subsidy.

Vanshare

For commuters who need help connecting between transit, ferry, Sounder and other train service, King County Metro VanShare is your solution.

Vanshare can be the first part of your commute—you, and up to 14 others, would take the vanshare from your home to a Park & Ride, train station or ferry terminal and then take the bus, train or ferry the rest of the way to work; or it could be the last part of your commute where you use transit to get to a Park & Ride, train station or ferry terminal and then you take a vanshare from there to your worksite.

Vanshares:

- Share a ride to connect to or from a bus, train, ferry or vanpool.
- Meet up at regularly scheduled times and days.
- Pay a \$185 monthly fare split between the group, that covers gas, insurance and van maintenance.
- Like a vanpool, members of the group volunteer to drive and help with the bookkeeping.
